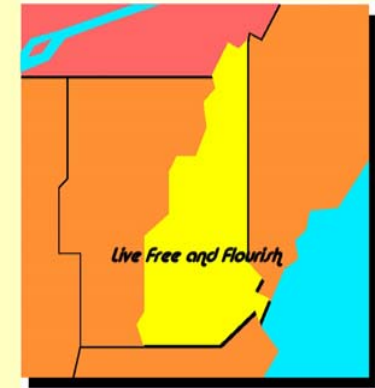

The Story of *New Pilgrim Chronicles*

It starts years ago, with the author's unique experience of the early reason-liberty movement. In those days, it "usually began



with Ayn Rand,' but the growth process of independent minds is unpredictable. Mr. Wright gravitated toward the Libertarian Party, becoming newsletter editor and

then chairman of the Libertarian Party of Michigan.

"Those were glory days," he says, "we were on top of the world. Especially, at the 1979 LP national convention in Los Angeles, I remember thinking, 'the real people who love freedom are center stage, now. Good solid principles for good, thinking people will be implemented shortly, everywhere.'"

It was not to be. At that time, Brian was not fully aware of the depths of conspiracies of power that had been operating worldwide for decades. The nascent libertarian movement was quickly undercut by the false front of the Reagan Revolution, not to mention being trivialized by the vaunted, corrupt two-party system. The inexorable growth

and solidification of central-state-corporatist power from that period results in our current political emergency.

Enter the Free State Project

"The Free State Project (FSP) came along in the nick of time," continues Mr. Wright. "Without a viable prospect of winning back natural human freedoms *some-where*, we have no chance of averting a worldwide downward spiral into tyranny and chaos." He believes the nature of American tyranny is theocratic fascism. "I have the most immense appreciation for Jason Sorens and the several heroic figures who have made the FSP a working reality."



Idea of the Book

During his writeup of the 2005 FSP Porcupine Festival, Brian decided that after he moved to New Hampshire he would share some diaries or chronicles with the incoming practical idealists. These were posted in the We Moved area on the FSP site.

In addition to covering general travel, living, and human-interest matters in the journals, Brian could not restrain himself from commenting on major issues affecting our still-small world of freedom-seekers.

His commentary was generally well-received among the Free Staters, but he needed to deliver his ideas independently of the FSP. So he developed his pieces into a full-fledged booklet of more universal appeal. In the book, he tackles some large issues and takes sides, including:

- Taking part in the modern **peace** movement, identifying the manifest evils and lies of the current federal state.
- Presenting the **Sacred Nonaggression Principle** as the saving precept for major social problems, including race, population, environment, health, education, and welfare.
- Establishing **reason** as the *sine qua non* of the exercise of political freedom, overcoming systems of dogmatic faith.
- Showing imminent prospects for **effective immortality** and transhumanist enhancement.
- Offering viable new energy and **quality-of-life** alternatives with **sustainable technologies** that are good for business, family farmers, and common people.
- Providing a listing of practical "what you can do's" to help people find their unique ways to **healthy community**.

With all the analysis and opinion, though, *New Pilgrim Chronicles* retains a touch of the common man. Brian Wright clearly enjoys his new terrain, and its people; he entertainingly conveys the pleasures and trials of moving to and living at "the Freedom Portal."
