Wright exclaims, “This is very exciting news. A small number of active freedom fighters can effect positive outcomes. We’ve already spurred major accomplishments, including:

- retaining citizen control of home schooling curricula
- returning to citizens several revenues that else would have entered state coffers
- stopping a smoking ban
- turning back federal RealID, and
- (we expect soon) decriminalizing marijuana for adult, personal use

“I like to see my book as a helpful tool for people who want to move here and fight for freedom, but also and possibly even more important, as a manifesto for citizen empowerment **everywhere** through community action and humanitarian application of the Sacred Nonaggression Principle,” concluded the author.
