Summary

This document has two parts: a) it briefly describes the American First Principles' Foundation (FPF) formation and development plan and b) it sketches the FPF's primary activist focus: implementing a vast, universal, grassroots, 'open source' system-network of American First Principles' grand juries (1stP_GJs) [aka PRIME (people's restored independent multilevel everywhere) grand juries] across the country.

Foundation

American First Principles are embodied in the "We hold these truths" paragraph of the Declaration of Independence, as written, most likely, by Thomas Paine with oversight and contributions from Thomas Jefferson. The condensed five principles are as follows:

1. **Natural rights** of the individual
2. **Equality** of individuals in law
3. **Government** solely to secure rights
4. **Just Powers** solely from The People
5. **The People's** right to fix/end govt.

The FPF is created to popularize and spread knowledge of American First Principles to the people and to sponsor its primary activist work of creating and sustaining the network of 1stP_GJs... as well as corresponding First Principles trial juries (1stP_TJs).

Here is the initial flow diagram for building the foundation, overall:

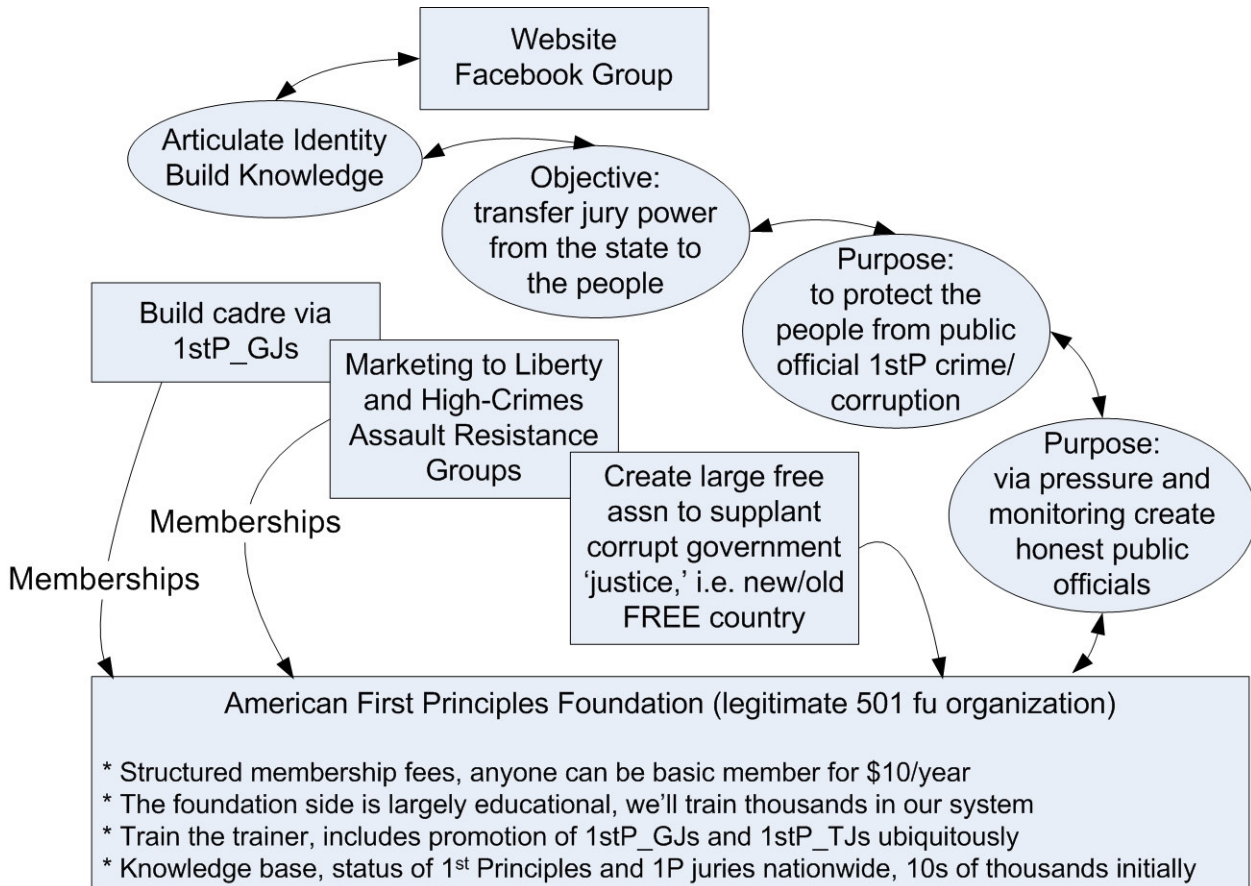
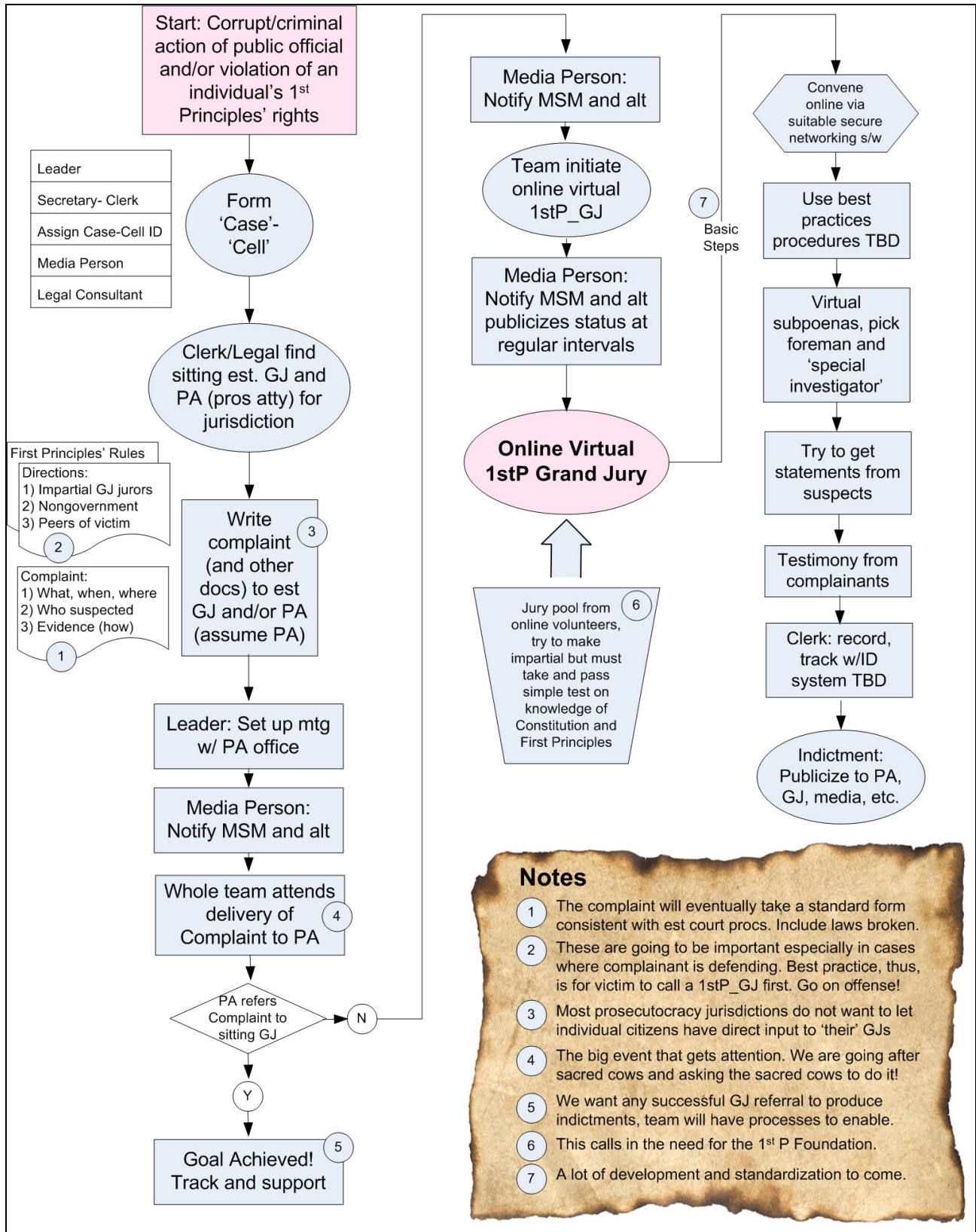


Figure 1: American First Principles' Foundation (FPF) Flow Chart

Principle #5 establishes the authority of The People to DIRECTLY oversee government activity and to bring corrupt, criminal public officials to trial of The People. What's shown below in Figure 2 is the basic process for initiating and submitting a case to a 1stP_GJ via an establishment, state grand jury and its handmaidens.



Notes

- 1 The complaint will eventually take a standard form consistent with est court procs. Include laws broken.
- 2 These are going to be important especially in cases where complainant is defending. Best practice, thus, is for victim to call a 1stP_GJ first. Go on offense!
- 3 Most prosecutocracy jurisdictions do not want to let individual citizens have direct input to 'their' GJs
- 4 The big event that gets attention. We are going after sacred cows and asking the sacred cows to do it!
- 5 We want any successful GJ referral to produce indictments, team will have processes to enable.
- 6 This calls in the need for the 1st P Foundation.
- 7 A lot of development and standardization to come.
