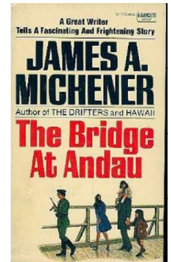

1964: Helped neighbor lady in Goldwater Campaign



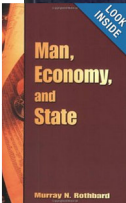
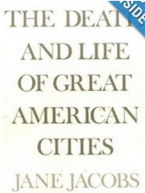
From Truman Years thru Eisenhower Years

1969. Young Americans for Freedom Convention in St. Louis. Split between conservatives and libertarians. Hess burns draft card (I think).



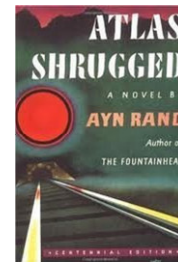

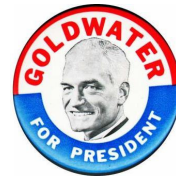

1979. Did ML, later became chair of LPM



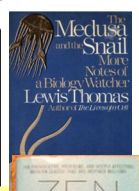
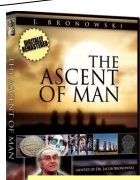

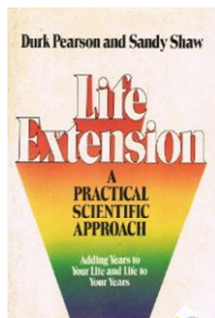

1979. Gala LP Convention in LA, nothing ever again came close.

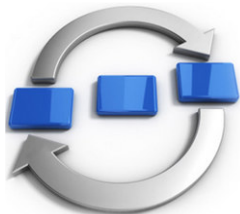


Early 80s much into LPM, chair a couple of times. 6000 volunteer signatures in 1982.

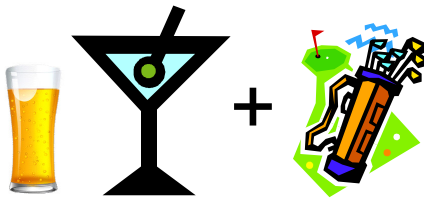

2 Discover I have a knack for editing, get job with EDS corporate comm. Spend a lot of time figuring out how not to cut in the federales.

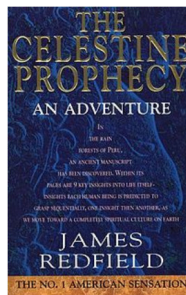
The 1990s:

I go contracting for real in 1996, leaving for Houston to do full technical description of Exxon's retail point of sale transaction system.

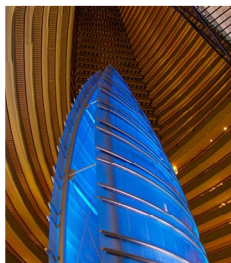


Return to Detroit area in 1999, with NBD. The corporate power dance turned it into Bank One and I bailed to MasterCard Debit Switch a mile away.

The 2000s



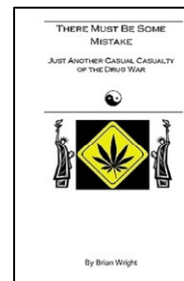
2004-2007. Attend original Porcupine Festival in '04, become early mover in '05. Write *New Pilgrim Chronicles*, 2006.

2000-2004. Making very good money now. Buy Audi A4, buy condo. Even with my wretched spending habits, I pay off all credit card debt, start savings.

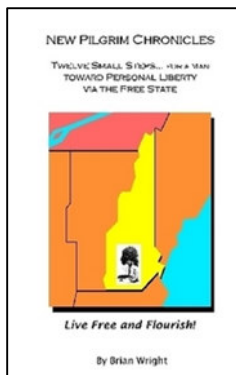


First writing was as a casualty of the Drug War. Incredible and grimly entertaining.

Basically, all my recorded political and spiritual contributions have come from 2001 thru the present

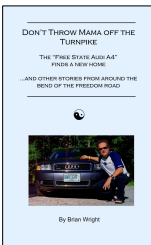

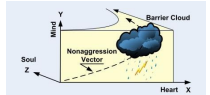
Never find work in the Free State. Mom ailing, and I return again to Motor City environs ~2007 early.

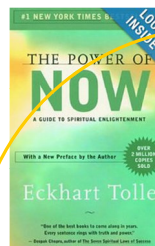


BW-unique insights (I think) (so far):

- Gravity Golf analogy

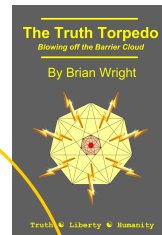

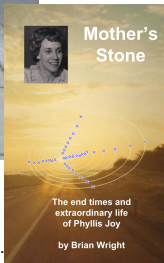
'Universal' Mission Statement
